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2. Scope

This procedure applies to all Faculty, staff, students, contractors, and third parties working on or under the control of KSU.

3. Responsibilities

The EHSDirector is responsible for developing and monitoring the overall University's EOS plan. KSUunits are responsible for developing unit specific EOSplans that are consistent with the University's EOS policy.

4. Procedure

A. Developing the Environmental and Occupational Safety Plan

- x The EHSDepartment develops a draft of the University's EOSplan, taking into consideration:
 - o The University's EOSegal requirements.
 - o EOShazards, risks, and significant environmental aspects.
 - o The University's operational and business requirements.
- x The EOS plan objectives and targets must be consistent with the University's EOS policy, be measurable and seek continuous improvement of EOS performance.
- x The EHSDirector publishes the draft of the new or altered plan for consultation with those responsible for drafting or reviewing EOS policies and procedures tensure consistency with the

B. Environmental and Occupational Safety Plans Developed by KSUUnits

KSU units may develop unitspecific EOS management plans that are consistent with the University's EOSpolicy. The Unit plan takes into consideration the University's EOS legal requirements, unit's EOSnazards, risks and significant environmental aspects, and the operational and business requirements.

Unit Heads ensure that, where practicable, the Unit's objectives and targets are measurable and seekcontinuous improvement. Unit Headsmonitor progress against the objectives and targets of the Unit's plan andreports on progress annually to the EHSD irector.
